Vision: All pupils leaving Wootton St Andrew's C of E VA Primary School will be physically literate. They will have the skills, knowledge, confidence and the motivation necessary to enable them to live a healthy lifestyle and have a lifelong involvement in physical activity and sport. #### **Comments regarding swimming**

As there is a pond with deep spring source close to the school, instruction about water-based rescue is part of the curriculum. All KS2 children receive swimming lessons and therefore progress over time is tracked through swim scheme. Those who excel against NC requirements are given First Aid and water safety instruction to cover a 'greater depth' element of the subject. For 2022/23 this was 3 pupils, 8% of the group, therefore 8% of transport costs allocated to this group. Total spend: £270.40 for transport and sessions.
